The Thurgood Marshall College Fund is pleased to present its annual statistical data report on the 47 member public HBCUs. The report is the most comprehensive data report on public HBCUs published annually to inform and advise the public on important trends. Please note that all data is based on the 2006-2007 matriculation year.



Enrollment at TMCF member institutions is stable, with 199,757 undergraduates; 29,676 graduate students; and 4,252 first professional students. Of particular note, undergraduate applications were up for both males and females over the previous year, while admissions jumped 22 percent.

As in previous years, we highlight institutional areas from student enrollment to degrees conferred. We've added a new section this year that provides a complete 20-year trend analysis on the following areas:

Demographic Report 2006-2007

Thurgood Marshall College Fund (TMCF) conducted the annual demographic survey of four year public Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). The data presented in the first half of the report is in aggregated form; the appendix has all institutional level data.

As in previous years, the report highlights all institutional areas from student enrollment to degrees conferred. New this year, we included:

We are pleased to report a 87% response rate for the 2006-2007 report. To ensure statistical validity and reliability measures were taken, TMCF used National Center for Education Statistics (IPEDs) data to guarantee accurate numbers were reported on all of the HBCU data profiles. The survey was administered using the Zarca Survey Tool and was sent to the Institutional Research departments and president's offices at all of the universities. This summer, TMCF will be producing the 2007-2008 Demographic report using National Center for Education Statistics (IPEDs) data. In Fall 2009, TMCF will be submitting the Demographic Report to cover data 2008-2009.

EXECUTIVE OVERVIEW

OVERALL ENROLLMENT

Current enrollment at TMCF member institutions is stable, with 199,757 undergraduates, 29,676 graduate students, and 4,252 first professional students.

GENDER AND ETHNICITY

Females represent 62% of undergraduate enrollment, 71% of graduate enrollment, and 59% of first professional enrollment.

Males represent the remaining 38% of undergraduate enrollment, 29% of graduate enrollment, and 41% of first professional enrollment.

Of the male population, 83% of undergraduates are black, 67% of graduate students are black, and 54% of first professionals are black.

Of the female population, 83% of undergraduates are black, 75% of graduate students are black, and 61% of first professionals are black.

STEM

Within Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics, undergraduate enrollment has increased from 9.5% of all undergraduate enrollment in 1986 to 11.2% in 2006. In 2006, men

primary enrolled in Engineering (49%) and Biological Science (32%), while women primary enrolled in Biological Science (70%) and Engineering (13%).

GEOGRAPHICAL DIVERSITY

Undergraduate enrollment came primarily from the Southeast (45%), Northeast (22%) and Southwest (20%); 3% of undergraduate enrollment came from outside the United States. Undergraduates enrolled from North Carolina (12%), Maryland (9%), Texas (8%),

Georgia (7%), and New York (6%). The previous year,

the top three states were North Carolina, Texas, and Louisiana.



In 2006, 18% of all undergraduates were part-time students – 15% of males, and 20% of females. White students were much more likely to be part-time than black students - 37% of white students were part-time while only 16% of all black students were part-time.



ADMISSIONS

Undergraduate applications jumped up 19% for both males and females over the previous year, totaling 151,655 applications.


Undergraduate admissions jumped up 22% over the previous year – 15% for males and 27% for females, totaling 86,599 offers of admission.

DEGREES CONFERRED

24,103 undergraduate degrees were conferred in 2006-07, an increase of 78% for females and 15% for males since 1986. During the last 20 years, master's degrees conferred have more than doubled for females while staying the same for males. For doctorate degrees in that time period, women's degrees have gone up over 400% while males have gone up 200%. Twenty years ago, males out-earned women for first professional degrees, but now women earn 50% more degrees than men.

The most popular undergraduate degrees were Business and Management (20%), Healthcare (9%), and Education (8%). While Business and Management were the most popular for both genders, males tended toward Computer Science and Security, while females gravitated to Healthcare and Psychology.

The dominant master's degrees were Education (2,420), Pubic Administration (1,021), Business and Management (593), and Healthcare (567). For doctorate degrees, the degrees were overwhelmingly conferred in Education (234), followed by Healthcare (50), and Psychology (31).



ENDOWMENTS

In 1986, the average TMCF member school had an endowment of \$3.3 million. In 2006, each school's endowment averaged \$14 million. Combined, TMCF schools reported total endowments of \$517 million.

COLLEGE COSTS

Undergraduate tuition, room, and board costs totaled \$14,400 for in-state public TMCF schools, \$21,000 for out-of-state public TMCF schools, and \$23,100 for private TMCF schools. For all categories, TMCF schools were more affordable than traditionally white institutions.

FINANCIAL AID

Over the previous 5 years, students are relying more on loans to support their education. Loans have increased by 82% since 2001 while federal grants have only increased by 39%. Federal grants to students at TMCF schools decreased in 2005 and 2006, while state and institutional grants have increased quickly.


FACULTY SALARIES

Tenured professors at TMCF member schools earn about 20% less than their counterparts at all four-year institutions, while associate and assistant professors earn about 10% less.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

TMCF schools provided continuing education courses to over 25,000 students in 2006. Half of all TMCF members provide after-school activities for K-12 schools in their community. Twenty-five (25) TMCF member institutions offer free public access to their libraries. Seventy-nine percent (79%) of TMCF schools are participating in "Going Green" initiatives to save energy.




Female students represent 62% of the total undergraduate

increase from 1986-1996 at 50%. Female students represent 71% $$
of the total graduate enrollment at TMCF member institutions in
the 2006-2007 academic year. While female graduate students
have increased their enrollment from 1996-2006 by 13%, males
have decreased their enrollment rates by 3%.

1986 to 2006 -


an increase of 97%.

UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT: 1986-2006


Percentages of Male Enrollment by Race and Ethnicity and Percentages of Female Enrollment By Race and Ethnicity.



UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT BY RACE AND GENDER: 1986-2006

Black and Hispanic male enrollment has increased over the last twenty years, while White male enrollment has decreased as a portion of overall enrollment. Hispanic and Asian female enrollment has more than doubled over the last twenty years, with the largest increase between 1986 and 1996. The Black female enrollment has increased from 72,690 to 104,288 in 1986 – 2006; however, White female enrollment has decreased substantially to 22% of the female population.







GRADUATE ENROLLMENT BY RACE AND GENDER: 1986-2006

Black male graduate enrollment increased from 3,461 to 5,719 which represents a 65% increase.

Likewise, Black females doubled their graduate enrollment rate (115%). From 1996 to 2006 both female and male White graduate enrollment rates decreased. However, both Hispanic male and female increased overall.






Graduate Enrollment: Percentages of Male Enrollment by Race and Ethnicity and Percentages of Female Enrollment By Race and Ethnicity.

FIRST PROFESSIONAL ENROLLMENT BY RACE AND GENDER: 1986-2006

Since 1986, both Black males and females have increased enrollment in first professional degree programs by 31% and 114% respectively. Both Hispanic and Asian, males and females have considerably increased their enrollment rates by nearly tripling their numbers in each category.




First Professional Enrollment: Percentages of Male Enrollment by Race and Ethnicity and Percentages of Female Enrollment By Race and Ethnicity.




UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS BY GENDER: 2001-2006

Female bachelor's degrees skyrocketed from 1987 to 1997 by nearly doubling their numbers, while males increased by 22%. However, from 1997-2007 males decreased their degree conferred by 6%, and females increased by 5%.


GRADUATE DEGREE CONFERRED


■ FIRST PROFESSIONAL

UNDERGRADUATE DEGREES CONFERRED BY RACE AND GENDER: 1996-2006



UNDERGRADUATE TOTAL COLLEGE COST: 1986-2006





Students are taking different routes to support their college education. Since 2001 financial aid loans have increased by 82%, compared to federal grants at 39%. Federal grants represent the largest total grants awarded to students, nearly doubling all other grants (institutional and state/local).

ENDOWMENTS: 1986-2006

The average endowment awarded to TMCF member institutions *nearly doubled* each decade since 1986. In 2006 the average endowment was \$13 million per year. The total endowment also doubled each decade since 1986, and in 2006 the total endowment for 38 reported schools was \$517 million.

DETAILED REPORT

APPLICATIONS AND ADMISSIONS

Of the 33 schools that responded completely to this year's survey, TMCF member institutions received a total of 46,956 freshman applications, 28,109 (60%) freshman were offered admission, and 11,184 freshmen enrolled. In the 2006-2007 academic school year, TMCF member schools received a total of 151,655 applications for undergraduate enrollment. Applications were up from 2001 by 52,300. Specifically male applications were up, as were female applications. Alabama A&M University, Tennessee State University, Alcorn State University, and Kentucky State University all more than doubled their applications between 2005 and 2006.

ENROLLMENT

Overall total enrollment (including undergraduate, graduate and doctorate level) in TMCF member institutions increased by 19% (31,071) between 1986 and 1996; and between 1996 and 2006 enrollment increased by 7% (11,975). Enrollment for first professional made a substantial increase over the last twenty years by 87% (1974), while enrollment in graduate programs increased over the same time period by 63% (11,440).

Florida A&M University had the highest total number of total enrolled students (11,907). followed by Texas Southern University (11,224) and North Carolina A&T State University (11,098). Winston-Salem State University and Southern University at Shreveport made the largest strides increasing their total enrollment over the last ten years by 96% and 88% respectively. Overall, enrollment decreased by 3.3% percent since 2005-2006.

COMPARATIVE ANALYSIS: ENROLLMENT

In 2006-2007 academic year, 8.7% (191,652) of all Black enrollment in post-secondary education were enrolled in TMCF member institutions.

ENROLLMENT: UNDERGRADUATE

Total undergraduate enrolled was the highest it has ever been reaching 199,757 in 2006-2007. This number has increased 6% in the last ten years. This year, we pulled data on undergraduate enrollment by major. Each section has a review of major by race and gender.

ENROLLMENT: GENDER

The majority of the growth from 1986 to 2006 in TMCF schools were from females; female enrollment increased by 39% percent and male enrollment increased by 13% percent during the last two decades.

Women represent 79% of the population at Coppin State University. Additionally, there are 8 universities where over 70 percent of their undergraduate population were females. Only Central State University had more men than women (877 men to 870 women); all other schools had an undergraduate population that was at least 53% female. (The table to the right represents the top 5 majors that females and males enrolled in 1986, 1996 and 2006; as well as the percent increase.)



ENROLLMENT: RACE/ETHNICITY

In 2006, African Americans represented 84% of the total population at TMCF member institutions, with the remainder coming from 8% White, 2% Hispanic, and 1% Asian. Over the last twenty years, Whites have decreased their undergraduate enrollment by 30%, while the Hispanic population has increased by 124%.

ENROLLMENT: FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME STUDENTS

A total of 163,993 students were enrolled in undergraduate coursework full-time, up from 1996 by 11%. Currently there are 35,764 part-time students representing 18% of the total undergraduate population. More men tend to enroll in full-time undergraduate coursework, compared to their female counterparts. Roughly, 85% of all males were enrolled full-time, and 15% were enrolled part-time; compared to 80% of full-time females and 20% of part-time females.

While Charles R. Drew University of Medicine and the University of the District of Columbia had full-time enrollment below 50%, Lincoln University of MO, Cheyney University, and Tuskegee University had over over 95% full-time enrollment.

ENROLLMENT: GEOGRAPHIC ORIGIN

ENROLLMENT: GRADUATE

Since the 1986-1987 academic year, females have outnumbered males in TMCF graduate schools. Males have decreased their presence from 1986 (38% of graduate population) to 1996 (32%), however, still lag behind females at 29% in the 2006-2007 academic year.

Total graduate students enrolled was the highest it has ever been reaching 28, 576 in 2006-2007. This number has increased 10% in the last ten years.

GENDER

The majority of the growth from 1986 to 2006 in TMCF schools was from females; female enrollment increased by 90% and male enrollment increased by 20% during the last two decades.



Overall, females continue to outnumber males by 2.48 to 1. Women represent over 80% of the graduate population at the University of the Virgin Islands, Charles R. Drew University of Medicine, Southern University at New Orleans, Elizabeth City State University, and Mississippi Valley State University. Tuskegee University and Kentucky State University have the most balanced graduate enrollment with 52% females.

RACE/ETHNICITY

African Americans represented 74% of the total TMCF member institutions' population, with the remainder coming from 17% White, 2% Asian, and 2% Hispanic. Over the last twenty years, African Americans have increased their population by 99% while White students have increased their population by 10%.

FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME STUDENTS

A total of 12,027 students were enrolled in graduate coursework full-time, up from 1996 by 31%. Currently there are 17,647 part-time students representing 59% of the total graduate population. Men tend to enroll in full-time graduate coursework more than their female counterparts. Roughly, 44% of all males were enrolled full-time, and 56% were enrolled part-time; compared to 39% of full-time females and 61% of part-time females. While Virginia State University, University of the Virgin Islands, Elizabeth City State University, and Chicago State University had full-time enrollment below 20%, West Virginia State University, Tuskegee University, and CUNY York had over over 80% full-time enrollment.



TRANSFER STUDENTS

A total of 10,756 undergraduate students transferred into TMCF member institutions. Black females represent over 50 percent of the total undergraduate population, and also transfer in at the same rate; while Black males represent 31 percent of the total undergraduate population, they are only 24% of the transfers into institutions. White females represent 5 percent of the total undergraduate population; however transfer rates were double that.

RETENTION AND DROPOUTS

THE AVERAGE PERCENT OF FIRST-TIME FULL-TIME DEGREE/CERTIFICATE-SEEKING UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS IN FALL 2005 RETURNING IN 2006 WAS 63% [1]

Howard University retained 85% of their students followed by Florida A&M University at 81% and Albany State University at 80%; compared to Langston University at under half of their students. The average percent of first-time part-time degree/certificate-seeking undergraduate students in fall 2005 returning in 2006 was 43%^[2], compared to 2002 returning in 2003 at 45%.

CHARLES R. DREW UNIVERSITY OF MEDICINE, ALCORN STATE UNIVERSITY, FORT VALLEY STATE UNIVERSITY AND VIRGINIA STATE UNIVERSITY REPORTED A 100% RETENTION RATE FOR PART-TIME STUDENTS FROM 2005-2006 SCHOOL YEAR, WHILE CENTRAL STATE UNIVERSITY ONLY RETAINED 16% AND SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY AND A&M COLLEGE 11%

ONLINE LEARNERS

Roughly 66% of all the 2-year and 4-year Title IV degree-granting institutions offered a credit-based college level distance learning course. Approximately 89% of all public, 53% of all private not-for-profit and 70% of private for-profit four-year institutions offered at least one distance learning course. In 2006-2007, an estimated of 12.2 million students were enrolled in 11,200 college-level online degree programs from the Title IV degree granting programs.

In 2006-2007, 28 universities reported offering an online degree program or distance learning courses and 10 universities responded that they currently do not have any online programs. A total of over 1,700 different courses were offered across 18 universities that reported, an average of 97. Both

Fayetteville State University and Prairie View A&M University had the most programs at 341 and 315 respectively.

The top three online programs alone enrolled 3,920 students in academic year 2006-2007. The top four programs based on enrollment came from Fayetteville State University: Cognitive Psychology (823),

Distance Education is "a formal education process in which the students and instructor are not in the same place.

Human Development (573), and two Sociology courses (483). Out of the twelve universities that responded, a total of 1,962 students were enrolled and registered as online or distant learning student online. Coppin State University had the most online only enrollment at 670 followed by Fayetteville State University with 500 students enrolled online only. Females outnumbered males in online enrollment by over three to one. Roughly 711 females were enrolled online full-time compared to 140 males, and 457 females were enrolled part-time compared to 154 males.

GRADUATE PROGRAMS

Out of the six schools that responded to having an online graduate degree program, there was a total of 8 programs altogether. North Carolina A&T State University had 16 graduate enrollments in the Information Technology Program followed by Instructional Technology with 13 enrollments and Health and Physical Education at three. Southern University and A&M College had a total of 11 enrollments in Rehabilitation Counseling and graduated ten students (4 males and 6 females). Kentucky State University's Special Education online graduate program had 23 students enrolled, but have not graduated any as of yet.

STUDENT EMPLOYMENT

EVERY STUDENT THAT ATTENDED HARRIS-STOWE STATE UNIVERSITY WORKED AS AN INTERN PRIOR TO GRADUATION AND 75% OF KENTUCKY STATE UNIVERSITY'S STUDENTS WORKED AS INTERNS.

A majority of Texas Southern University's students (80%) secured employment in their majors prior to graduation followed by Kentucky State University at 65% and Tuskegee University at 45%. All of Cheyney University of Pennsylvania's students secured employment in their major after graduation, followed by Kentucky State University at 90%, Texas Southern University at 79% and Tuskegee University at 75%.

STUDY ABROAD PROGRAMS

21% of public HBCUs offer study abroad prgrams.

UNIVERSITIES GAVE REGARDING HAVING SMALL ENROLLMENT NUMBERS IN THEIR STUDY ABROAD PROGRAMS:

- Maximum enrollment allowed in the program is two total students. The program gets considerable amount of applications, however, space is extremely limited. University of Maryland-Eastern Shore stated that, "There is a great interest in study abroad opportunities were more readily available."
- Study abroad programs are very costly, and many students/families can not afford the associated financial responsibility. Funding assistance would be helpful to support students abroad.
- Budgetary constraints and lack of financial aid limit enrollment.

DEGREES CONFERRED

NEARLY 1-IN-7 BACHELOR'S DEGREES

EARNED BY AFRICAN-AMERICANS IN 2006-2007 WERE EARNED AT TMCF MEMBER INSTITUTIONS. 9.1% OF ALL MASTER'S, 11.7% OF ALL FIRST PROFESSIONAL DEGREES, AND 10% OF ALL DOCTORATE DEGREES EARNED BY AFRICAN-AMERICANS WERE FROM TMCF MEMBER INSTITUTIONS.

Of the 24,103 bachelor's degrees conferred in 2006–07, the largest numbers of degrees were conferred in the fields of Business and Management (4802), Health Professions (2,172), and Education (1,895). At the master's degree level, the largest numbers of degrees were in the fields of Education (2,420) and Public Administration (1,021). The fields with the largest number of degrees at the doctor's degree level were Education (234), Health Professions (50), and Psychology (31). TMCF member institutions graduated 24,103 bachelor's degrees, 6,865 master's degrees and 496 doctorate degrees. Bachelor's degrees overall increased by 50% over the last twenty years, compared to 85% increase in master's and 259% increase in doctorates.

OVERVIEW: UNDERGRADUATE

In 2006-2007 academic year the total number of degrees conferred by TMCF member institutions totaled 24,103. At a total of 8,656 graduates, the three most popular undergraduate majors were: 1. Business and Management 2. Health Professions 3. Education which was roughly 37% of all degrees. A more thorough analysis of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) and Education programs is found later in this publication.

OVERVIEW: GRADUATE

In 2006-2007 academic year the total number of master's and doctorate degrees conferred by TMCF member institutions totaled 7,361. Out of those degrees 93% were master's, and 7% were PhDs.

During this academic year, Education (2,518 students) and Public Administration (1,076 students) together represented over 52% of the total number of master's degrees. Doctorate degrees were predominately in Education (237 of 496 PhDs granted).

OVERVIEW: GRADUATE

Women were more represented in master's degrees in almost all areas, especially Theology and Religious Vocations (91% female), Health Professions (87%), and Psychology (84%); men were the predominant degree earners in Engineering (68%), Parks and Recreation (64%), and Computer and Information Sciences (58%).

For doctorate degrees, women out-earned men in the following fields: Theology and Religious Vocations (82% female), Communication and Journalism (82%), and Natural Resources and Conservation (80%). Men were the predominate degree earners in Area, Ethnic, Cultural, and Gender Studies (100%), and Mathematics and Statistics (100%), and Physical Sciences (76%).

A Closer Look: Education Majors

OVERVIEW: UNDERGRADUATE EDUCATION ENROLLMENT

Education was one of the most popular fields of study in 2006, with a total number of 18,735 enrolled in their bachelor's, which represented 10% percent of the total undergraduate enrollment. The total number of education enrollment increased/decreased from 17,802 in 1996 to 18,735 in 2006.

OVERVIEW: UNDERGRADUATE EDUCATION DEGREES CONFERRED

In 1986-1987 academic-year the total undergraduate awards/degree conferred by Education program totaled 2,159, increasing by 48% in 1996-1997 academic year to 2,906.

Between 1996 and 2006, the most popular education sub-fields stayed consistent.

A Closer Look: STEM

Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics

In 1991, the National Science Foundation (NSF) funded the LSAMP program to improve and increase the percentage of enrolled and completions of minorities in the STEM field. All TMCF member institutions participate and engage in LSAMP-sponsored activities and programs. Over half of the students who participate in LSAMP have a grade point average (GPA) of 3.25 or above. Nearly 38% of all students who participate in LSAMP in the undergraduate program will move on into a graduate degree program in the STEM field.

OVERVIEW: UNDERGRADUATE ENROLLMENT - STEM DISCIPLINES

Enrollment in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics programs increased by 57% over the last two-decades, with the highest increase from 1986-1996. Currently a total of 23,531 are enrolled in their bachelors STEM programs, which represented 11.8% of the total undergraduate enrollments. Women have more than doubled their presence in these degree programs since 1986.

In 2006-2007,


men composed 74% of the undergraduate engineering enrollment and 82% of the undergraduate engineering degrees conferred. Men also composed over 56% of the graduate degrees conferred, including 74% of engineering doctorate degrees.

OVERVIEW: UNDERGRADUATE DEGREES CONFERRED STEM DISCIPLINES

In 1986-1987 academic-year the total undergraduate awards/degree conferred for all STEM program's totaled 3,763, increasing by 25% to 4,701 in 1996-1997 and dropping to 4,042 in 2006-2007.

These figures represent an overall 7.5% increase in undergraduate STEM degrees conferred in the last twenty-years. In 2006-2007 females represented half of the STEM degrees earned, and have


females represented half of the STEM degrees earned, and have increased their degrees conferred by nearly 40% over the last two decades, while men have decreased by 13%.



OVERVIEW: GRADUATE ENROLLMENT - STEM DISCIPLINES

STEM graduate enrollment has increased by 80% since 1986. Particularly, women have more than doubled their presence over the last two-decades, but men still continue to out number women by about 19%. In 2006-2007, 52% of men are most commonly enrolled in Engineering, followed by Biological Sciences, while 51% of women were enrolled in Biological Sciences, followed by Engineering.

OVERVIEW: GRADUATE DEGREES CONFERRED - STEM DISCIPLINES

Master's degrees conferred have increased by 52% since 1986-1987, with heavy reliance on females who increased their degrees conferred by 135%. Doctorate students have quadrupled their degrees conferred in STEM fields since 1986-1997; females in particular have increased their numbers by 500%.


In 2006-2007 the total full-time tenured or on tenure track faculty was 6,532, where men represented 59% and females represented 41%. Men still significantly outnumber women in tenured positions; tenure track men slightly outnumber women; women slightly outnumber men in non-tenure positions.

Cheyney University had an almost equal number of male and female tenured professors (51% male). Fort Valley State University, Alcorn State University, Lincoln University of Pennsylvania, Central State University, and Charles R. Drew University of Medicine and Science all had faculties over 75% male.

The largest racial-gender group of faculty was the African American females, at 28.4% of the entire faculty population, followed closely by African American males at 28%.





Associate professors and assistant professors at four-year public HBCUs earn about 10% less than their counterparts at four-year public institutions, while tenured professors make about 20% less than their counterparts.

Comparing HBCU Public and Private schools, associate and assistant professors earn about the same, while HBCU Public tenured professors earn about 10% less than their counterparts at HBCU Private schools.




NON-TENURED SALARY




ADMINISTRATORS, RESEARCH, AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

African-Americans make up approximately 75% of the administrators, research, and support personnel.



COLLEGE COSTS

In the 2006-07 academic year, annual prices for undergraduate tuition, room, and board were estimated to be \$14,345 for in-state students at TMCF public institutions, compared to \$20,949 for out-of-state students, and \$23,149 for private HBCU institutions. Between 1996-97 and 2006-07, prices for undergraduate tuition, room, and board at public institutions rose by 38% for in-state students, 45% for out-of-state students, and prices at private institutions rose by 26% percent. During the 1996-97 to 2006-07 period, consumer prices rose by 28%.

The graph below shows the Average Public and Private HBCU, from 1986-2006:



Public four-year HBCUs continue to be the more affordable than private HBCUs. The average tuition and fees for in-state public HBCUs is lower by \$7,300 than private HBCUs or about 30% of the private tuition.

EXPENDITURES

Over the last two-decades trend data show substantial increases in the current-fund expenditures per student at TMCF member institutions, with significant increases from 1996 to 2006. The average total expenditure per full-time student in the following areas increased from \$6,294 to \$11,610 between 1986 and 2006.

The 2006-2007 fund expenditures at TMCF member institutions reached an all time high of \$3.7 billion dollars, a slight increase from the previous year's \$3.6 billion. Salaries accounted for 45% of the expenses. The table below lists all expenditures by category and institution.

ALUMNI CONTRIBUTIONS

TMCF member institutions contacted 269,872 alumni for support during the 2006-2007 academic year.

A little over 20,00 alumni made a financial aid contribution in 2006-2007. On average, 910 alumni contributed to each institution. Universities with the highest number of total contributions were Southern University and A&M College (3,000), BlueField State (2,000) and Central State (1,851).

Of the 18 schools that reported contributions, there was a total contribution \$5,671,368, an average of \$315,076 per school. Langston University, Jackson State and South Carolina State University had the largest contribution in terms of total dollars contributed. Langston had the highest average contribution per donor at \$2,949.

Prairie View, Maryland Eastern Shore, Langston and Central State each had single alumni donations of \$100,000 or more.

Central State (23%), Bluefield State (17%) and Virginia State (10%) had the highest alumni contribution rates from the schools. The average alumni contribution rate was 4%.

PRIVATE SUPPORT

Fourteen schools reported that the amount raised from private support in 2006-207 was over \$23 million. From 2004-2005 to 2006-2007 academic year, institutions increased their total and average private support by 35%.

During these same years, Langston University increased their private support by over 400%, followed by the University of the Virgin Islands with a 200% increase.

TECHNOLOGY

Out of the 28 schools that responded to this section, 25 (89%) had a technology strategic plan for 2006-2007. This was an increase from the previous year where only 27 schools had a strategic technology plan. Additionally, 78 percent stated their institution had improved or updated their plan since January 2007. More specifically, four universities updated their technology plan, 17 updated in 2008 and 1 will update in 2009. All of the universities used a Microsoft based program, and most used Dell computers.

SCHOOL REFORM

Most institutions (25 out of 28) supported and or directly worked with their local public school districts to assist with reform initiatives.

Charter schools or small learning communities were supported by 8 universities; 2,160 students were supported in 2006-2007. Coppin State provided the most support, serving 805 students, followed by Southern University and A&M College (460) and University of the District of Columbia (335).

Some examples of programs that institutions currently work with the local school districts include: Upward Bound, The TRIO programs, Charter School initiatives, Teacher Education Professional Development Schools, Early Childhood Development Centers, Services Learning Programs, Action Research, Leadership Program, Bridge to Education program, Special Education – UVICEED.

Note: 28 out of 47 Institutions responded.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

Over half of all universities provided after school activities for K-12 public schools in their communities. About 38% (12 out of 32 respondents) of institutions hosted a community outreach program, supporting 15,279 patrons.

PUBLIC LIBRARIES

Twenty-five universities offer free public access into their institutions libraries, with more than 412,207 community patrons accessing a TMCF member institution library in 2006-2007 academic year. Southern University and A&M hosted 370,397 patrons, Chicago State hosted 22,001 and Alcorn State hosted 7,903 total patrons.

GOING GREEN INITIATIVES

79% OF TMCF UNIVERSITIES REPORTED PARTICIPATING IN AN "ENERGY CONSERVATION PROGRAM."

Five of the programs involve the surrounding community and nine programs collaborate or partner with another institution or agency. The University of the Virgin Islands offers the most energy conservation programs on campus, which include: Recycling, Alternative fuels, Energy Efficient Light bulbs, Energy savers appliance purchase, Electronic A/C and lighting control systems. The below charts represented the energy conservation initiatives that universities participated in during the academic year 2006-2007.
